


# Welcome to the Innovation You assessment!

The assessment is a useful tool to help you get started on the path to meaningful change.

To help understand the assessment process, we'll take a look at an example.



There are three parts to the assessment. The first part is the 'Personal' section. Here, Bob will respond to the guestions in this part as they relate to his identity and the role he will play in working on this challenge.

Every question includes four options. To answer each question, Bob will rank the four responses according to the relative importance that he places on each. The assessment uses these relative ranks in building the profile that will guide your progress.







The second part of the assessment is the 'Communal' section. Here, Bob will respond to the questions as they relate to the community of people that are the key stakeholders in his challenge. In this case, Bob chooses his son's friends and immediate family members since they provide the kind of influence and support that will most directly affect Bob's challenge.

In the same manner as before, Bob will respond to each question by ranking the four responses according to how they reflect the community that he identified.

The third and final part of the assessment is the 'Universal' section. Here, Bob will respond to the questions as they relate to the broader situation and environment that relates to his challenge. In this case, Bob will consider the school district, the local job market and maybe even the broader economy as key factors.

Once again, Bob will respond to each question in this section by ranking the four choices according to how they reflect the broader environment surrounding the challenge.



Once completed, Innovation You will generate a customized report according to your responses. This assessment report and the associated materials will provide a concrete set of tools and methods to help you achieve success with your goals.
